

## Metro Flood Diversion Authority Adds Senior Construction Manager

**FARGO, ND** (August 24, 2022) – The Metro Flood Diversion Authority recently hired Tom Fuchs as its first senior construction manager. In this role, he works directly with leadership across multiple organizations and construction sites for the Fargo-Moorhead Area Diversion comprehensive project.

"With the Red River Valley Alliance now on board, the pace of construction is picking up on the diversion," said Kris Bakkegard, MFDA director of engineering. "Adding Tom to our small team will help us better manage the half-dozen different project sites currently under construction as well as the others that will continue to be added as work progresses on the diversion channel, southern embankment, control structures and wetland mitigation areas."

Fuchs brings 17 years of experience in construction project management that includes an emphasis on heavy civil construction projects. He previously worked on Louisiana's West Closure Complex, which is a major component of the Greater New Orleans Hurricane and Storm Damage Risk Reduction System, as well as numerous infrastructure projects in Colorado, Texas, Oklahoma, Iowa and Ontario.


