A regular meeting of the Metro Flood Diversion Authority Board of Authority was held on March 27, 2025. The following members were present: Bernie Dardis, Mayor, City of West Fargo; Dr. Tim Mahoney, Mayor, City of Fargo; Chuck Hendrickson, Moorhead City Council; David Ebinger, Clay County Commissioner; Jim Kapitan, Cass County Commissioner; Duane Breitling, Cass County Commissioner; Tony Grindberg, Cass County Commissioner; Lisa Borgen, Moorhead City Council; Rick Steen, Cass County Joint Water Resource District; Dave Piepkorn, Fargo City Commissioner and Shelly Carlson, Mayor, City of Moorhead

Member(s) absent: Kevin Campbell, Clay County Commissioner and Denise Kolpack, Fargo City Commissioner.

1. CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Grindberg called the meeting to order at 3:30 PM. Roll call was taken, and a quorum was present.

2. APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM THE FEBRUARY 6, 2025, MEETING

Mr. Breitling moved to approve the minutes from the February 6, 2025, meeting and Mr. Ebinger seconded the motion. On a voice vote, the motion carried.

3. APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM THE FEBRUARY 27, 2025, MEETING

MOTION PASSED

Ms. Borgen moved to approve the minutes from the February 27, 2025, meeting and Mayor Carlson seconded the motion. On a voice vote, the motion carried.

4. APPROVE THE ORDER OF THE AGENDA

6. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR UPDATE

Mr. Benson reported that the first milestone payment has been made to the Red River Valley Alliance for \$14.4 million.

Mr. Benson reported that there will be a community meeting in Horace on April 15, to discuss County Roads 16 and 17 and upcoming closures. The sheriff's department, emergency management and fire personnel will also be in attendance.

Mr. Benson also reported that there has been a lot of positive support for funding on HB2024 that potentially would provide for the completion of the City of Moorhead in-town projects as well as projects in Wolverton, Comstock and Georgetown.

7. GENERAL COUNSEL UPDATE

a. Technical Dispute Review Board Update

Mr. Shockley provided an update reporting that Mr. Chris Kane, JD, PE, has been appointed to the TDRB. Mr. Shockley indicated that Mr. Kane is an attorney and may have more of a comfort level operating within the open meeting parameters.

8. PROJECT UPDATES

a. USACE Project Update

Mr. Bakkegard provided the following USACE update:

1 Diversion Inlet Structure (DIS) – Construction

Structure includes 3-50 ft. wide Tainter gates. Construction is 99% complete. Construction completion date will be revised pending outcome of modifications to the gate machinery design. Schedule for remaining work: 2025: Complete operating machinery corrections; commissioning and training.

2 Wild Rice River Structure (WRRS) - Construction

Structure includes 2-40 ft. wide Tainter gates. Construction is 98% complete. Revised construction completion date is 6 August 2025. Schedule for remaining work: 2025: Complete operating machinery corrections; commissioning and training.

3 I-29 Raise - Construction

Includes approximately 4 miles of interstate raise between County Roads 16 and 18. Construction is 100% complete. Partial turnover to MFDA occurred on 20 December and preparation of O&M documents is ongoing.

4 Red River Structure (RRS) – Construction

Structure includes 3-50 ft. wide Tainter gates. Construction is 74% complete. Construction completion date is 29 April 2026. Tainter gate #3 welding and concrete placements for approach apron and dam walls continues.

5 Drain 27 Wetland Mitigation Project Plantings - Construction

Native plantings 5-year contract awarded 17 May 2023. Completion date for wetland establishment is 1 December 2027.

6 Drayton Dam Mitigation Project Design – Construction

Construction is complete. Turnover to MFDA for O&M occurred on 28 Nov 2023. OMRRR manual will be finalized once MFDA provides comments.

7 Southern Embankment – Reach SE-2A – Construction

Construction is 76% complete but continues to be behind schedule. Scheduled completion date of 13 October 2024 was not met. Revised schedule and completion date pending.

8 FY2024 Contract Awards:

OHB Ring Levee: Awarded 22 February and is 50% complete. Contract completion date is 24 September 2025.

Reach SE-1B: Awarded 27 February and is 31% complete. Contract completion date is 13 March 2026.

Reach SE-2B: Awarded 11 March and is 37% complete. Contract completion date is 23 August 2026.

Forest Mitigation #1: Contractor is preparing lands for additional planting next season.

Reach SE-4: Awarded 28 May and is 5% complete. Contract completion date is 3 June 2026.

9 FY25 Contract Awards:

SE-3: Awarded 2 January 2025. Contract completion date is 11 September 2026.

SE-5: Contract was awarded on 30 January 2025 to BCSS, LLC of Tempe, AZ for \$10,097,097. Forest Mitigation #2: Contract awarded 24 February 2025 to DJM Ecological Services for \$1.23M.

c. Project Safety Update

Mr. Bakkegard provided the safety update for the period February 1 to February 28, 2025. He reported that there was one recordable incident as a result of a slip/fall and there were no other incidents to report.

d. P3 Monthly Update

Mr. Bakkegard an update highlighting the P3 utility area:

The only remaining utility relocation designs, the 3 Construction Document Submittals (CDS) from WAPA were received in February.

Design summary by Utility submittals:

- All 61 required Preliminary Design Reports (PDRs) and 79 Final Design Reports (FDRs) are approved.
- 96% of Construction Document (CD) submittals, 80 of 83 total for utility relocations, have been approved.
- 98.7% (220 of 223) of the total anticipated utility design submittals (PDR, FDR & CD) have been approved.
- 80 sets of RFC Documents have been approved for 102 Utility Buildable Units (BUs). This is 97% of the 105 utility BUs in RRVA's scope of work. The last 3 are for WAPA CDS which are currently in review.
- 112 Inspection and Test Plans (ITPs) have been approved for Utility activities.
- 51 shop drawing submittals for Developer managed Utility relocations are approved.

Overall, 31 of 108 identified utility conflicts (29%) have all work including HDD void grouting and removal of abandoned facilities completed, 16 relocations and 15 removals only BUs.

To date, 34 of the 44 total HDD installations have the voids grouted on both the entry and exit sides. Relocations for 54 of the 61 utilities to be constructed under the channel are tied-in or cut over.

Adjustments for only 2 of the 14 overhead electric transmission lines crossing the channel ROW are complete; Otter Tail Power (OT1) 115 kV line to remain in place and the Xcel Energy (XE3) 230 kV line south of 32nd Ave W.

10. LAND MANAGEMENT UPDATE

a. Property Acquisition Status Report

Mr. Dodds provided the following property acquisition status report:

- 98.4% completion in the Construction Footprint
- 58.4% completion in the UMA Footprint
- 95.3% of the parcels in the Southern Embankment have been acquired
- 58.4% of the parcels in the Upstream Mitigation Area have been acquired
- 77.6% of the Environmental Easements have been signed
- 100.0% completed: Stormwater Diversion Channel; Oxbow-Hickson-Bakke levee; in-town levees and the Drayton Dam mitigation

Key Activities:

- Continued negotiating settlement agreements for existing eminent domain actions
- In the last month, successfully closed on 6 parcels / 6 owners in the UMA and Sheyenne River Benching
 portion of the Project
- Completing appraisal reports for Christine area flowage easements and Horace Mobility Improvements
- Continuing the process of disposing of Excess Lands
 - o 39 parcels / 681.26 acres have been approved as Excess Lands
 - 8 parcels / 262.36 acres are moving through the Policy
 - 31 parcels / 418.90 acres have been sold or pending closing

11. FINANCE UPDATE

a. Sales Tax Update 2024 Collections

Mayor Dardis reported that the March bills payable totaled \$1,344,567, and the current grand total net position is \$330,992,481. Mayor Dardis also reported that the sales tax receipts for 2024 received from Cass County totaled \$23,304,345, and the 2024 total received from the City of Fargo totaled \$69,824,744, bringing the total receipts to a little over \$93,000,000.

b. H&H Modeling for FEMA Certification Presentation

a., i. Budget Change Request 019/2025 Cash Budget Amendment

This Budget Change Request (BCR) facilitates two transactions to support HMG Task Order 102 Amendment 9.

1. Reallocate \$2 million of existing program budget reserved under the "Certification" Work Breakdown Structure (WBS) to the Engineering and Design Fees WBS. This amount will be apportioned between years 2025 & 2026.

Budgets in 2025 and beyond have increased due to the accelerated schedule to the FEMA Physical Map Revision, additional permit compliance monitoring and cemetery mitigation support.

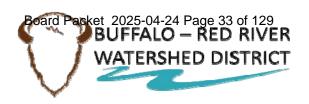

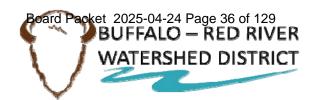

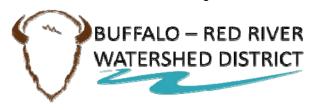

SECOND AMENDMENT TO DISTRICT MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT TO DISTRICT MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (the "Second Amendment") is made and entered into this 24th day of April, 2025 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the METRO FLOOD DIVERSION AUTHORITY, a political subdivision of the State of North Dakota (the "Authority"), and the RUSH RIVER WATER RESOURCE DISTRICT, a political subdivision of the State of North Dakota (the "District").

WHEREAS, construction of the locally preferred plan for the Fargo-Moorhead Metropolitan Area Flood Risk Management Project (the "Comprehensive Project") at the Fargo, North Dakota, and Moorhead, Minnesota, metropolitan area was authorized by Section 7002(2) of the Water Resources Reform and Development Act of 2014, Public Law 113-121; and

WHEREAS, the Authority is the local sponsor responsible for delivering the Comprehensive Project; and

WHEREAS, on December 17, 2020, the Authority, the District, the Southeast Cass Water Resource District, the Maple River Water Resource District, the North Cass Water Resource District, and the Cass County Joint Water Resource District entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (the "Master MOU"), outlining the respective roles and responsibilities of all of the parties for the SWDCAI of the Comprehensive Project; and

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2022, the Authority and the District entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (the "District MOU") to further outline the roles and responsibilities as between the Authority and the District for the SWDCAI; and

WHEREAS, on January 26, 2023, the Authority and the District entered into a First Amendment to District Memorandum of Understanding (the "First Amendment") to supplement the terms of the District MOU; and

WHEREAS, the Authority and the District now desire to enter into this Second Amendment to include additional roles and responsibilities of the Parties for the work associated with the SWDCAI.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants made herein and for other valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the Authority and the District agree as follows:

ARTICLE I. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION

Section 1.01 DEFINITIONS. All capitalized terms used and not otherwise defined herein will have the meanings given to them in this Second Amendment and as defined in this section unless a different meaning clearly applies from the context.

- "Authority" means the Metro Flood Diversion Authority, a political subdivision of the State of North Dakota and a permanent joint powers entity formed through the Joint Powers Agreement to provide the Fargo-Moorhead metropolitan area with permanent and comprehensive flood protection.
 - "Authority Representative" means the individual identified in Section 8.06.
- "Business Day" means any day that is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or a federal public holiday.
- "Comprehensive Project" means the Fargo-Moorhead Metropolitan Area Flood Risk Management Project authorized by Section 7002(2) of the Water Resources Reform and Development Act of 2014, as generally described in the Final Feasibility Report and Environmental Impact Statement, Fargo Moorhead Metropolitan Area Flood Risk Management, dated July 2011 and approved in accordance with the Chief's Report, as amended by the Supplemental Environmental Assessment, Fargo-Moorhead Metropolitan Area Flood Risk Management Project, dated September 2013 and approved by the U.S. Army Engineer, St. Paul, on September 19, 2013, and as amended by the Second Supplement Environmental Assessment dated August 27, 2018 (2018 SEA), and the Engineering Documentation Report, Fargo-Moorhead Metropolitan Area Flood Risk Management Project, ND and MN, Modifications Through February 2019.
- "Data Sheets" means the River Inlet and Drain Inlet Data Sheets attached to the Master MOU as exhibit C.
- **"Developer"** means Red River Valley Alliance, LLC, a limited liability company formed under the laws of the State of Delaware that entered the Project Agreement with the Authority to design, finance, build, operate, and maintain the SWDCAI. References to the Developer throughout this Second Amendment include references to other entities engaged by the Developer to complete such work.
- **"District"** means the Rush River Water Resource District, a political subdivision of the State of North Dakota.
- "District MOU" means the Memorandum of Understanding by and between the Metro Flood Diversion Authority and Rush River Water Resource District, dated as of January 27, 2022, further defining roles and responsibilities for the SWDCAI.
 - "District Representative" means the individual identified in Section 8.06.
- "Drain 2 Inlet Interface" means the interface constructed at the upstream boundary of the Project Limits by the Authority/Developer, as shown in Exhibit C, in accordance with the design data and physical channel characteristics specified in the Revised Data Sheet, between the Drain 2 Inlet Transition and the SWDCAI through which waters of Drain 2 will flow into the SWDCAI.
- **"Drain 2 Inlet Transition"** means the structure which will allow existing Drain 2 to transition into the Drain 2 Inlet Interface near the Project Limits as shown in Exhibit C.

- "Drain 12 Inlet Interface" means the interface constructed at the upstream boundary of the Project Limits by the Authority/Developer, as shown in Exhibit B, in accordance with the design data and physical channel characteristics specified in the Data Sheet, between the Drain 12 Inlet Transition and the SWDCAI through which waters of Drain 12 will flow into the SWDCAI.
- **"Drain 12 Inlet Transition"** means the structure which will allow existing Drain 12 to transition into the Drain 12 Inlet Interface near the Project Limits as shown in Exhibit B.
- "Drain 30 Inlet Interface" means the interface constructed at the upstream boundary of the Project Limits by the Authority/Developer, as shown in Exhibit A, in accordance with the design data and physical channel characteristics specified in the Data Sheet, between the Drain 30 Inlet Transition and the SWDCAI through which waters of Drain 30 will flow into the SWDCAI.
- **"Drain 30 Inlet Transition"** means the structure which will allow Drain 30 to transition into the Drain 30 Inlet Interface near the Project Limits as shown in Exhibit A.
- "Effective Date" means the date on which both Parties have executed this Second Amendment.
- **"First Amendment'** means the First Amendment to District Memorandum of Understanding by and between the Authority and the District, dated January 23, 2023.
- "Joint Powers Agreement" means the agreement entered into by and between the City of Moorhead, Minnesota; the City of Fargo, North Dakota; Clay County, Minnesota; Cass County, North Dakota; and the Cass County Joint Water Resource District, dated as of June 1, 2016, to create the Authority.
- "Legal Assessment Drain" means any "project" as defined under Chapter 61-16.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, financed in whole or in part by special assessments, including natural watercourses opened, or proposed to be opened, and improved by drainage and any artificial drains of any nature or description constructed for that purpose, including dikes and appurtenance works, which are financed in whole or in part by special assessments.
- "Master MOU" means the Memorandum of Understanding by and between the Metro Flood Diversion Authority, Southeast Cass Water Resource District, Maple River Water Resource District, Rush River Water Resource District, North Cass Water Resource District, and Cass County Joint Water Resource District, dated December 17, 2020, defining roles and responsibilities for the SWDCAI.
- **"Party"** means the Authority or the District, as the context may require, and its respective legal representatives, successors, and permitted assigns.
- **"Person"** means an individual, a general or limited partnership, a joint venture, a corporation, a limited liability company, a trust, an unincorporated organization, or a governmental authority.

"Project Limits" means the permanent property interests for the SWDCAI.

"Revised Data Sheet" means the revised River Inlet and Drain Inlet Data Sheet for Drain 2, as shown on the attached Exhibit D.

"Storm Water Diversion Channel and Associated Infrastructure" or **"SWDCAI"** means the approximately 30-mile, 20,000 cubic feet per second (cfs) channel and associated features, including the outlet, river and drain inlets, road bridges, railroad bridges, and aqueducts, to be constructed as part of the Comprehensive Project.

"USACE" means the United States Army Corps of Engineers.

Section 1.02 TERMS GENERALLY. The definition of terms in this Second Amendment will apply equally to the singular and plural forms of the terms defined. Whenever the context may require, any pronoun will include the corresponding masculine, feminine, and neuter forms. The words "include," "includes," and "including" will be deemed to be followed by the phrase "without limitation." Unless the context requires otherwise (a) any definition of or reference to any agreement, instrument, or other document in the Second Amendment will be construed as referring to the agreement, instrument, or other document as amended, supplemented, or otherwise modified (subject to any restrictions on amendments, supplements, or modifications in the Second Amendment); (b) any reference in the Second Amendment to any person will be construed to include the Person's successors and assigns; (c) all references in the Second Amendment to articles, sections, exhibits, and schedules will be construed to refer to articles and sections of, and exhibits and schedules to, this Second Amendment; and (d) the words "asset" and "property" will be construed to have the same meaning and effect and to refer to any and all tangible and intangible assets and properties, including cash, securities, accounts, and contract rights.

ARTICLE II. MASTER MOU AND DISTRICT MOU

Section 2.01 INCORPORATION. The District, as well as other local water resource districts, entered into the Master MOU with the Authority for work that will be completed by the Developer. The District and the Authority additionally entered into the District MOU, supplemented by the First Amendment, to further define the roles and responsibilities as between the District and the Authority for the SWDCAI. This Second Amendment expressly incorporates all provisions of the Master MOU and the District MOU, as supplemented by the First Amendment, and is intended to supplement those agreements. In the event this Second Amendment conflicts with any term or condition of the Master MOU or the District MOU, as supplemented by the First Amendment, this Second Amendment will control.

ARTICLE III. DRAIN 30 INLET TRANSITION

Section 3.01 DRAIN 30 INLET TRANSITION. The District will be responsible for designing and constructing the Drain 30 Inlet Transition. The Parties anticipate the District will construct the Drain 30 Inlet Transition within the current footprint of Drain 30 and on OIN 543X, property not owned by the Authority as of the Effective Date. The District is responsible for

property acquisition and will consult with the Authority prior to determining the price at which it will offer to purchase property rights; the District will only offer to purchase property rights at a price consented to by the Authority. The District is additionally responsible for identifying and coordinating any utility relocations that may be necessary as a result of construction of the Drain 30 Inlet Transition. The District will submit designs for the Drain 30 Inlet Transition, along with utility relocation information, to the Authority for review and comment. The Authority will return comments to the District on a design and utility relocations within fourteen (14) calendar days of receipt. The Authority will reimburse the District for costs and expenses incurred for acquiring the property rights, for permitting, for utility relocations, and for designing and constructing the Drain 30 Inlet Transition.

Section 3.02 FUTURE DRAIN 30 EXPANSION. The District expects an expansion of Drain 30 may be necessary in the future. The District will be responsible for constructing any expansion and for any property acquisition required for such an expansion. In the event the Authority owns property that is required for the expansion, the District may seek to purchase a property interest from the Authority but with the understanding that the Authority must follow its excess lands policy before any sale of a property interest to the District could occur and another purchaser may have priority over the District to purchase the property interest. If the expansion will occur within the Project Limits, then the District will coordinate design with the Authority and submit designs to the Authority for review and comment. The Parties agree and acknowledge that a Section 408 permit, or a like successor permit, may be necessary from USACE for work within the Project Limits, and the Parties will work together in good faith to acquire such a permit if necessary.

ARTICLE IV. DRAIN 12 INLET TRANSITION

DRAIN 12 INLET TRANSITION. The District will be responsible for Section 4.01 designing and constructing the Drain 12 Inlet Transition. The Parties anticipate the District will construct the Drain 12 Inlet Transition within the current footprint of Drain 12, including construction expanding to approximately two hundred (200) feet west of 167th Avenue South, and on OINs 510Y and 511Y which are currently owned by the Authority. In the event the Drain 12 Inlet Transition will be constructed elsewhere, the District is responsible for land acquisition and will consult with the Authority prior to determining the price at which it will offer to purchase property rights; the District will only offer to purchase property rights at a price consented to by the Authority. The District is additionally responsible for identifying and coordinating any utility relocations that may be necessary as a result of construction of the Drain 12 Inlet Transition. The District will submit designs for the Drain 12 Inlet Transition, along with utility relocation information, to the Authority for review and comment. The Authority will return comments to the District on a design and utility relocations within fourteen (14) calendar days of receipt and will transfer ownership of the footprint of the Drain 12 Inlet Transition on OINs 510Y and 511Y to the District following approval of the design of the Drain 12 Inlet Transition by the Authority. The Authority will reimburse the District for costs and expenses incurred for acquiring any property interests, for permitting, for utility relocations, and for designing and constructing the Drain 12 Inlet Transition.

Section 4.02 FUTURE DRAIN 12 EXPANSION. The District expects an expansion of Drain 12 may be necessary in the future. The District will be responsible for constructing any expansion

and for any property acquisition required for such an expansion. In the event the Authority owns property that is required for the expansion, the District may seek to purchase a property interest from the Authority but with the understanding that the Authority must follow its excess lands policy before any sale of a property interest to the District could occur and another purchaser may have priority over the District to purchase the property interest. If the expansion will occur within the Project Limits, then the District will coordinate design with the Authority and submit designs to the Authority for review and comment. The Parties agree and acknowledge that a Section 408 permit, or a like successor permit, may be necessary from USACE for work within the Project Limits, and the Parties will work together in good faith to acquire such a permit if necessary.

ARTICLE V. DRAIN 2 INLET TRANSITION

Section 5.01 Drain 2 Inlet Transition.

- The District will be responsible for designing and constructing the Drain 2 Inlet (a) Transition. The Parties anticipate that the Drain 2 Inlet Transition will be constructed between slightly upstream of the Drain 2 crossing of 105th Street North and the Drain 2 Inlet Interface, potentially on portions of OINs 897Y, 897N, 898N1, 895N, and 2381N depending on the design, property owned by the Authority. In the event the Drain 2 Inlet Transition will be constructed elsewhere, the District is responsible for land acquisition and will consult with the Authority prior to determining the price at which it will offer to purchase property rights; the District will only offer to purchase property rights at a price consented to by the Authority. The District is additionally responsible for identifying and coordinating any utility relocations that may be necessary as a result of construction of the Drain 2 Inlet Transition. The Drain 2 Inlet Transition will include a reconstruction of Drain 2 and of a low water crossing under 105th Street North, which the District will design and construct to be of equal service and utility as that existing on the Effective Date. The Authority will enter into an access agreement with the District on OINs 897Y, 897N, 898N, 895N, and 2381N to construct and maintain the Drain 2 Inlet Transition. Prior to accessing any parcels owned by the Authority, the District will also notify the Developer.
- (b) The District will submit designs for the Drain 2 Inlet Transition, along with utility relocation information, to the Authority for review and comment. The Authority will return comments to the District on a design and utility relocations within fourteen (14) calendar days of receipt. The Authority will transfer ownership of the Drain 2 Inlet Transition on the affected portions of OINs 897Y, 897N, 898N1, 895N, and 2381N to the District following approval of the design of the Drain 2 Inlet Transition by the Authority. The Authority will reimburse the District for costs and expenses incurred for acquiring the property rights, for permitting, for utility relocations, and for designing and constructing the Drain 2 Inlet Transition, including those incurred as a result of the above-described reconstruction and low water crossing.
- **Section 5.02** FUTURE DRAIN 2 EXPANSION. The District expects an expansion of Drain 2 may be necessary in the future. The District will be responsible for constructing any expansion and for any property acquisition required for such an expansion. In the event the Authority owns property that is required for the expansion, the District may seek to purchase a property interest from the Authority but with the understanding that the Authority must follow its excess lands policy before any sale of a property interest to the District could occur and another purchaser may

have priority over the District to purchase the property interest. If the expansion will occur within the Project Limits, then the District will coordinate design with the Authority and submit designs to the Authority for review and comment. The Parties agree and acknowledge that a Section 408 permit, or a like successor permit, may be necessary from USACE for work within the Project Limits, and the Parties will work together in good faith to acquire such a permit if necessary.

ARTICLE VI. DRAIN MAINTENANCE

Section 6.01 Remnants. The District will be responsible for operating and maintaining all portions of Drains 2, 12, 29, and 30 that remain Legal Assessment Drains following the completion of work for the SWDCAI. The impacts to Drains 2, 12, 29, and 30 resulting from SWDCAI construction will necessitate reassessment and reduction of their corresponding assessment districts. Following the reassessment and reduction of the assessment districts, the District may need additional funds for maintenance expenses. To the extent the corresponding assessment district for Drain 2, 12, 29, or 30 does not generate sufficient funds for necessary maintenance of its respective Legal Assessment Drain, the District may submit a request to the Authority for the Authority to contribute funds to eliminate the shortfall between the amount generated by the assessment district and the amount of the necessary maintenance. The Authority will not unreasonably withhold approval of the request.

ARTICLE VII. TERM AND TERMINATION

Section 7.01 TERM. The term of this Second Amendment will be coterminous with the District MOU, and this Second Amendment will terminate upon the termination of the District MOU.

ARTICLE VIII. MISCELLANEOUS

- **Section 8.01** COMPLETE AGREEMENT. Except as otherwise expressly set forth herein, the Master MOU, the District MOU, the First Amendment, and this Second Amendment contain the entire and exclusive understanding of the Parties with respect to the subject matter contained therein and supersede all prior written or oral agreements, undertakings, statements, representations, and negotiations between the Parties.
- **Section 8.02** COUNTERPARTS. This instrument may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original, but all of which together will constitute one and the same instrument.
- **Section 8.03** AMENDMENTS. This Second Amendment may be amended only by written instrument duly executed by the Parties or their respective successors or assigns, except to the extent expressly provided otherwise in this Second Amendment.
- **Section 8.04** SEVERABILITY AND SAVINGS CLAUSE. Each provision, section, sentence, clause, phrase, and word of this Second Amendment is intended to be severable. If any provision,

section, sentence, clause, phrase, or word hereof is held by a court with jurisdiction to be illegal or invalid for any reason whatsoever, the illegality or invalidity will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Second Amendment.

Section 8.05 FORCE MAJEURE. No Party will be liable to the other Party during any period in which its performance is delayed or prevented, in whole or in part, by any of the following circumstances: war, civil war, violent act of foreign enemy, or armed conflict; nuclear, chemical, or biological contamination; ionizing radiation; or act of terrorism. If any circumstance occurs, the Party claiming the delay must undertake reasonable action to notify the other Party.

Section 8.06 AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES. The Authority and the District designate the following as their initial authorized representatives, respectively, to administer this Second Amendment:

(a) Authority Representative: Kris Bakkegard, Director of Engineering

(b) District Representative: Melissa Hinkemeyer, Secretary

Section 8.07 NOTICE.

- (a) All notices under this Second Amendment will be in writing and (i) delivered personally; (ii) sent by certified mail, return receipt requested; or (iii) sent by a recognized overnight mail or courier service, with delivery receipt requested, to the following addresses.
- (b) All notices to the Authority will be marked as regarding the Comprehensive Project and will be delivered to the following address or as otherwise directed by the Authority Representative:

(c) All notices to the District will be marked as regarding the Comprehensive Project and will be delivered to the following address or as otherwise directed by the District Representative:

(d) Notices will be deemed received when actually received in the office of the addressee (or by the addressee if personally delivered) or when delivery is refused, as shown on the receipt of the U.S. Postal Service, private courier, or other person making the delivery. Notwithstanding the foregoing, all notices received after 5:00 p.m. Central Time will be deemed received on the first Business Day following delivery.

Section 8.08 GOVERNING LAW. This Second Amendment will be governed and construed in accordance with North Dakota law.

Section 8.09 ELECTRONIC SIGNATURES. The Parties agree that the electronic signature of a Party to this Second Amendment shall be valid as an original signature of such Party to this Second Amendment.

PROJECT LIMITS AND TRANSITIONAL AREA MAP – DRAIN 30

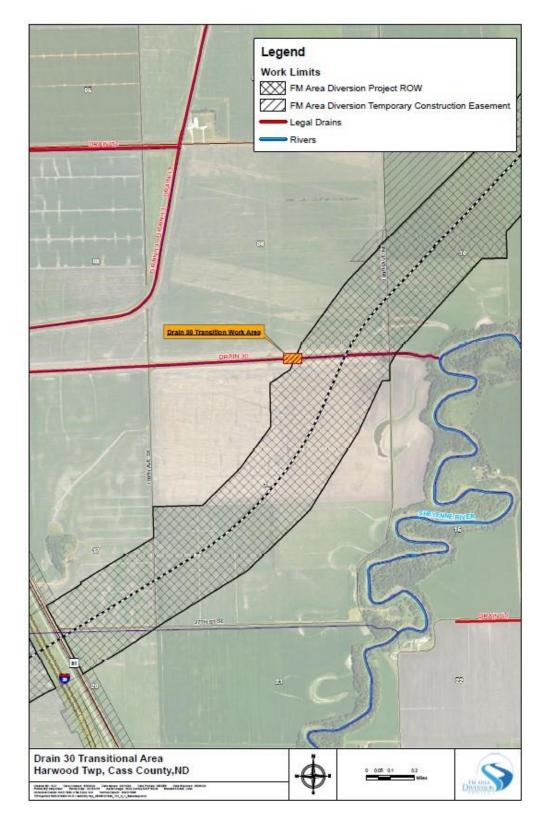

PROJECT LIMITS AND TRANSITIONAL AREA MAP – DRAIN 12

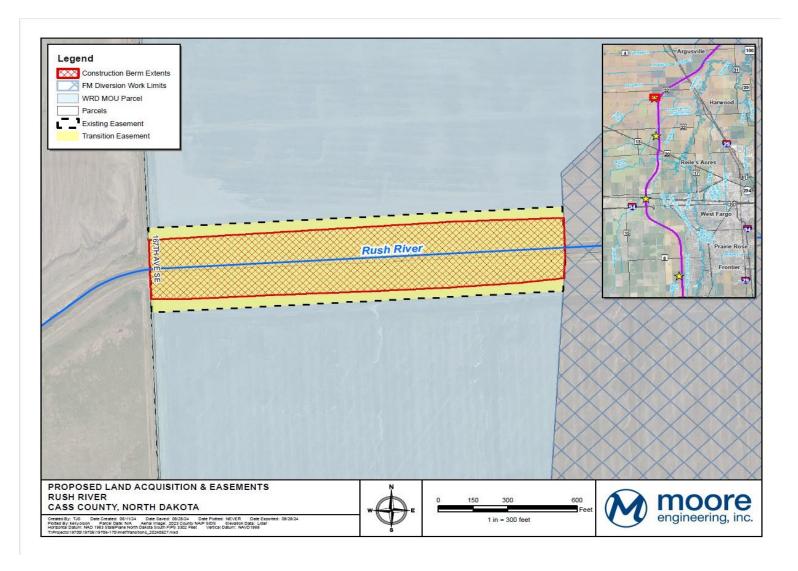

PROJECT LIMITS AND TRANSITIONAL AREA MAP – DRAIN 2

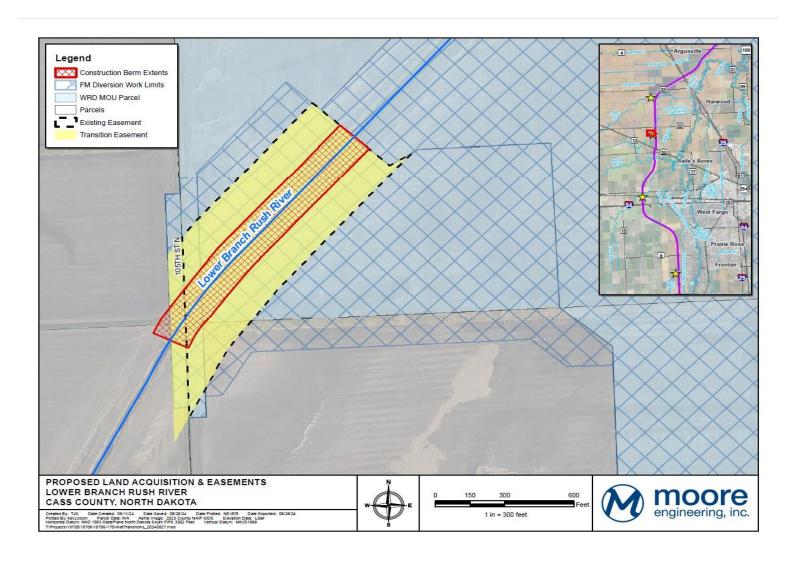
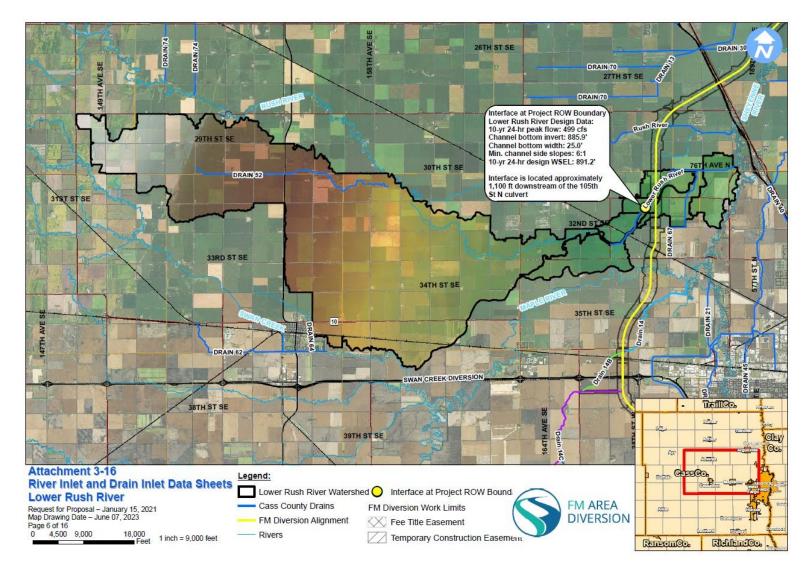

1 Recommendation for action:

The Executive Director has reviewed and recommended approval of the following Contract Action(s).

2 Summary of Contracting action:

Per the contract review and approval procedures that were adopted by the Metro Flood Diversion Authority on November 10, 2016, and amended December 16, 2021, the Owner's Program Management Consultant (PMC) or Engineer of Record (EOR) is directed to task orders and task order amendments for existing Master Services Agreements (MSA) and submit them to the Executive Director and Member Entity Technical Representative (METR) for review. The METR will provide comments to the PMC who will combine the comments for the Director of Engineering. The Director of Engineering (DOR) will review and provide recommendations to the Executive Director for review and action.

3 Reason why it is required

Cass County Electric work in the Upstream Mitigation Area Zone 1 includes the following:

- Subtask 01 Install two miles of underground three-phase distribution line to replace the
 overhead line going through the sections 22 and 27 in Township 137N Range 49W (along 173rd
 Ave SE from 51st Street to 53rd Street). Easements have been obtained for the work.
- **Subtask 02** Retire two miles of overhead three-phase distribution line going through sections 22 and 27 in Township 137N Range 49W. A new underground line will replace this line.
- Subtask 03 Bury 1.25 miles of underground three-phase distribution line going through sections 15 and 16 in Township 137N Range 49W. the new underground line will replace the existing OH line currently in service.

4 Background and discussion

CH2M, now Jacobs, has served as the Program Management Consultant (PMC) to the OWNER since November of 2011, with primary responsibilities to plan and implement the Fargo-Moorhead Area Diversion Project (the PROJECT). As such, the OWNER and CONSULTANT have agreed to enter into a Task Order focused on managing and reporting on the various aspects of the PROJECT. The PMC reports directly to the Executive Director.

In accordance with Section 2.01 of the Mater Utility Relocation Agreement between the Metro Flood Diversion Authority (the "Authority") and Cass County Electric, Inc ("Utility") dated May 27, 2021 (the "Agreement"), the Authority and the Utility agree to the above services.

1 Diversion Inlet Structure (DIS) – Construction

Structure includes 3-50 ft. wide Tainter gates. Construction is 99% complete. Construction completion date is currently 30 June 25. Schedule for remaining work: 2025: Complete operating machinery corrections; commissioning and training.

2 Wild Rice River Structure (WRRS) – Construction

Structure includes 2-40 ft. wide Tainter gates. Construction is 98% complete. Revised construction completion date is 6 August 2025. Schedule for remaining work: 2025: Complete operating machinery corrections; commissioning and training.

3 Red River Structure (RRS) - Construction

Structure includes 3-50 ft. wide Tainter gates. Construction is 74% complete. Construction completion date is 29 April 2026. Tainter gate #3 welding, bridge assembly, and concrete placements for approach apron and dam walls continues.

4 Southern Embankment – Reach SE-2A - Construction

Construction is 76% complete but continues to be behind schedule. Scheduled completion date of 13 October 2024 was not met. Revised schedule and completion date pending.

5 Drain 27 Wetland Mitigation Project Plantings - Construction

Native plantings 5-year contract for wetland establishment. Completion date is 1 December 2027. Contractor replanting areas disturbed by adjacent producers.

6 FY2024 Contract Awards - Construction:

OHB Ring Levee: 50% complete. Contract completion date is 24 September 2025.

Reach SE-1B: 31% complete. Contract completion date is 13 March 2026.

Reach SE-2B: 45% complete. Contract completion date is 23 August 2026.

<u>Forest Mitigation #1</u>: Contractor to remobilize late April. Contract completion date is 31 Dec 2028.

Reach SE-4: 5% complete. Contract completion date is 3 June 2026.

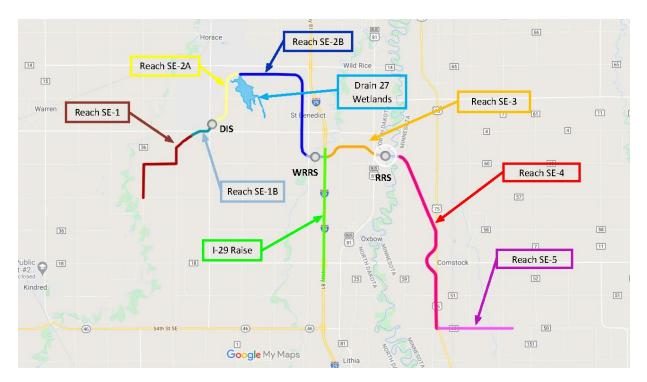

Turnover to MFDA for O&M occurred on 28 Nov 2023. OMRRR manual coordination continues.

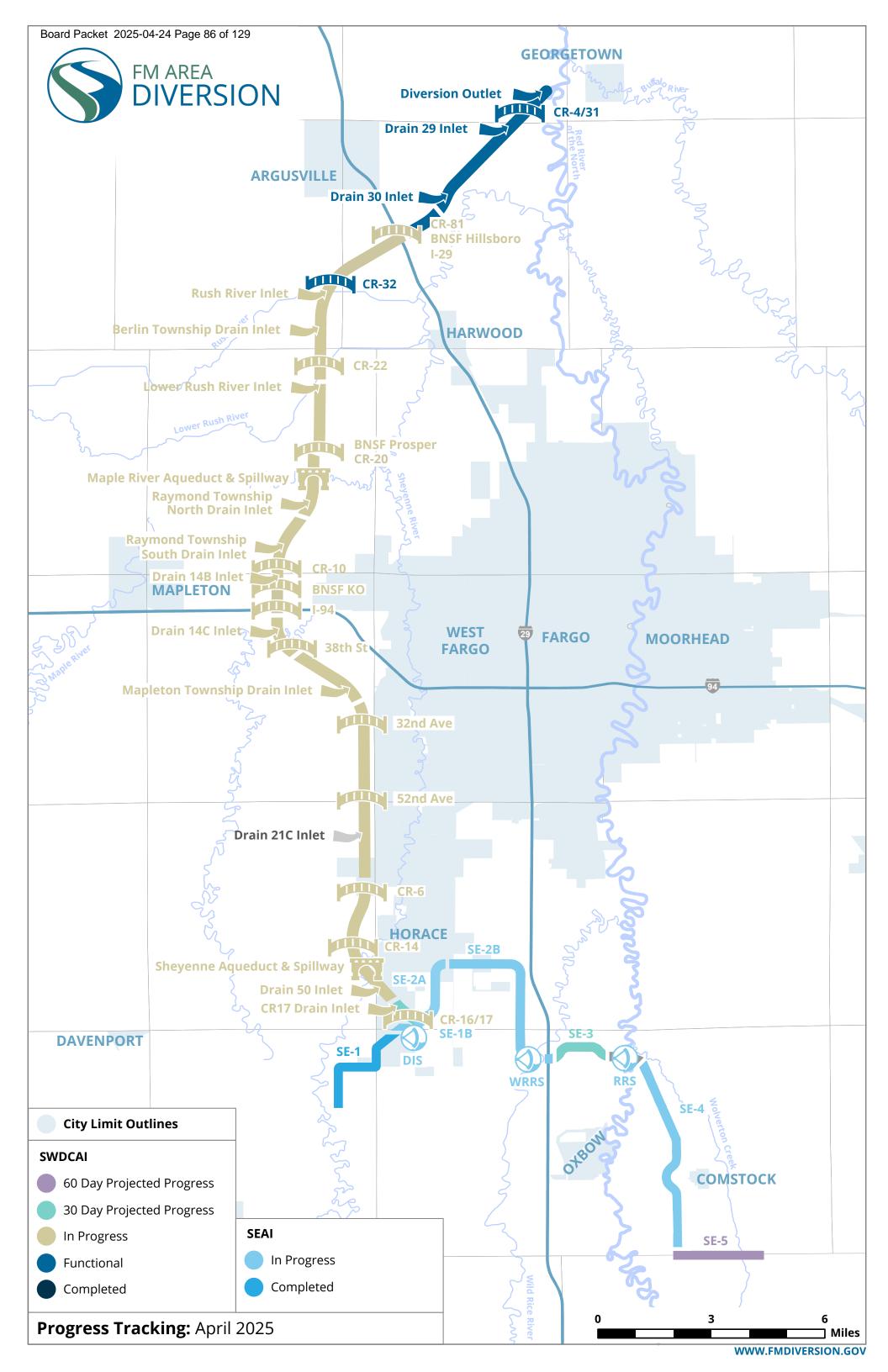


Fargo-Moorhead Metro FRM – Federal Work/Southern Embankment and Control Structures

DIS = Diversion Inlet Control Structure

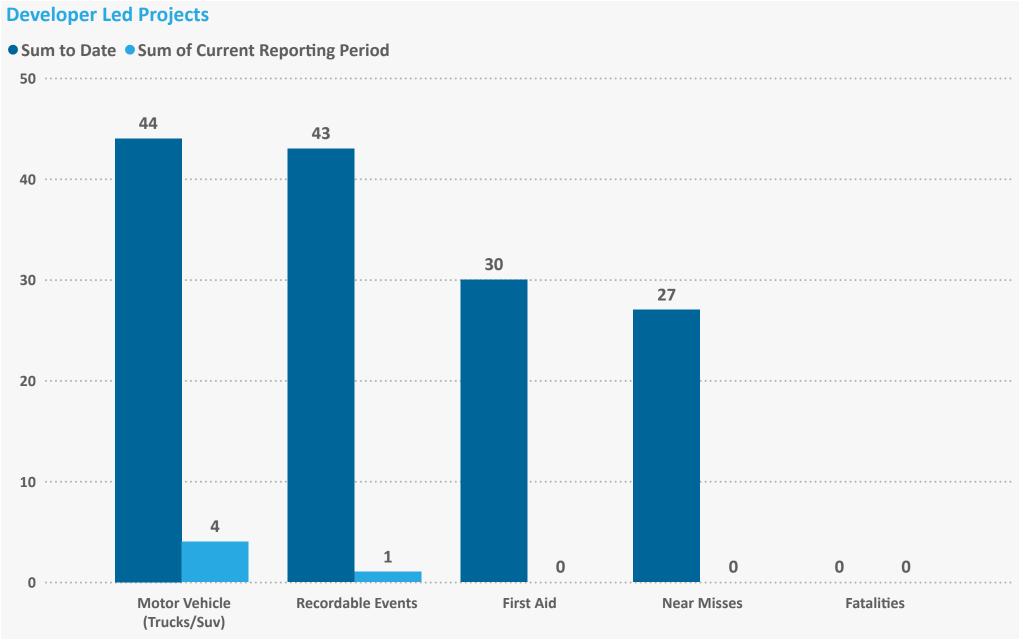
WRRS = Wild Rice River Control Structure

PMC P3 SUMMARY REPORT FOR MARCH 2025

Issue Date - April 17, 2025

PROGRESS

Construction of the SWDCAI is approximately 60%¹ complete based on Earned Value from RRVA's latest Schedule Submittal. The work during the reporting period is summarized below.

- **General:** Work <u>project wide</u> has been constrained this period by adverse weather. However, remobilization ramped up towards the end of the reporting period.
- Aqueducts: Maple River Aqueduct Rebar to wingwalls #1 and #2. Erecting formwork to sections of wingwalls #7 and 8. Placing concrete to sections of wingwall #3 and vehicle barrier to wingwall #7. Driving sheet piles to the spillway. Sheyenne River Aqueduct Placing gravel and geogrid and epoxy coated rebar to section 3 and 4 and placing concrete to Sections 2 and 4 of the flume floor foundation. Erecting Epoxy coated rebar to the west abutment wingwall and piers 1 and 2. Formwork for stage 1 of wingwall #3.
- **Stormwater Diversion Channel**: Localized work to Maintenance Road/Trail in Reaches 1 and 4. Excavation to main channel in Reaches 12 and 13.
- Interstate Crossings: I-29 Erecting formwork to Northbound bridge deck.
- County Road Crossings: <u>CR 81 Crossing</u>: Placing concrete to south abutment wingwalls. <u>CR 22 Crossing</u>: erecting formwork for end walls. <u>CR 20 Crossing</u>: Work to Texas Corral rail vehicle barrier. <u>38th St Crossing</u>: Placing concrete for vehicle barrier, stem walls and sleeper slabs. <u>32nd Ave Crossing</u>: Installation of formwork to wing-walls and overhangs for all spans. <u>CR 6 Crossing</u>: placing concrete to pier cap #1. Rebar and concrete to west abutment wingwalls. <u>CR 14 Crossing</u>: Placing concrete to pier cap #2. Erecting formwork and placing concrete to east abutment and wing-walls. <u>CR 16/17 Crossing</u>: Dewatering and placing formwork, rebar and concrete for pile cap at pier #2.
- Hydraulic Structures: <u>Rush River Inlet</u>: Driving sheet piles and H-piles for abutments and piers. <u>Raymond North Township Drain Inlet</u>: Placing 72" reinforced concrete pipe and backfill. <u>Drain 14B Drain Inlet</u>: installing rebar, erecting formwork and placing concrete for headwalls.
- **Diversion Outlet**: Investigations continue for compliance issues.
- Railroad Crossings: <u>BNSF Hillsboro Railroad Crossing</u>: Erecting formwork and placing concrete to piers #2, #5 and #6. Sanding and griding completed concrete. Placing concrete to north abutment wingwalls and south abutment pier cap. <u>BNSF Prosper Railroad Crossing</u>: Drilling cores for girder concrete pedestal preparation. <u>BNSF K.O. Railroad Crossing</u>: driving H-piles to east abutment and west abutment.
- Roadways: no activity this period
- Authority Administration Building (AAB): no construction work this period.

Observed progress during the reporting period and percentage complete for each buildable unit (BU) is set forth in Attachment A – Construction Progress by Buildable Unit.

General Administration

Significant preparation is ongoing for the first Interim Completions including records reviews and walk-throughs for punch lists. Unresolved Nonconformances and Noncompliance Events, unresolved major defects, submittal of records, and missing lien waivers continue to cause delays in Certification of Interim Completion.

Large amounts of staff time are taken up with correspondence exchange on meritless commercial issues.

The Authority and the Developer are seeking replacement members from the Alternative Dispute Resolution community; however, so far it has proven challenging to find people from that community prepared to engage in the highly unusual approach to conduct Alternative Dispute Resolution meetings in public.

COMMERCIAL

Compensation and Relief Events

By the end of March 2025, RRVA had submitted notices of 32 (thirty-two) Compensation Events and 2 (two) Relief Events. A summary and status of the Compensation Events and Relief Events is in *Attachment B – Submitted Compensation Events (CEs) and Relief Events (REs)*.

Change Requests

A change request (CR) can be initiated by the Authority or RRVA, and it is the mechanism set out in the Project Agreement to modify the Technical Requirements to resolve issues, clarify requirements, or modify the scope of RRVA's work.

There have been 24 (twenty-four) Authority-initiated change requests (ACRs) through the end of the reporting period with 1 (one) pending issue by the Authority. 12 (twelve) have been agreed-to and progressed to agreed-upon change orders, totaling a cost to the Authority of \$5,380,700.38 and a credit to the Authority of \$950,000. 3 (three) ACRs were withdrawn, and 7 (seven) are pending negotiation with RRVA. A summary of the ACRs is in Attachment C – Authority Change Requests.

There were 56 (fifty-six) developer-initiated change requests (DCRs) through the end of the reporting period. 34 (thirty-four) have been agreed to and progressed to agreed-upon change orders, totaling \$3,712,553.63 cost to

The Developer and the Authority has entered into a 'without prejudice' agreement, and an extension thereto, for the Developer to incorporate epoxycoated reinforcing steel into those structures that do not yet have Released For Construction Documents.

the Authority. 1 (one) is pending negotiation with RRVA. A summary of the DCRs is in *Attachment D – Developer Change Requests*.

PROJECT CONTROLS

Schedule

The Developer submitted the twenty-ninth Project Status Schedule (PSSU) update on March 14, 2025, for the month of February 2025 (01-Mar-25 Data Date). The submittal was accepted for review. To create the PSSU, the Developer reported making approximately 9,786 changes to the previous PSSU, including new and deleted activities, changes to logic and relationships between activities, activity description changes, calendar changes, WBS modification and activity duration modifications. The Project Substantial Completion Date in this PSSU is March 10, 2027, which differs from the January 2025 PSSU Project Substantial Completion Date by thirteen days (March 23, 2027). The approved PBS Project Substantial Completion Date (Scheduled Project Substantial Completion Date) is October 1, 2026 – a difference of 160 days from the January 2025 Project Substantial Completion Date.

Invoicing and Payment

BNSF has submitted 89 invoices through the month of March. These have been forwarded to the Developer for payment for work performed by BNSF and its subcontractors at the Prosper, Hillsboro and KO locations. 84 of the 89 were paid for a total of \$ 8,647,868.17. The BNSF Construction and Maintenance Agreement (C&M Agreement) between the Authority and BNSF is considered a "Third Party Agreement" as administered under Section 11 of the Project Agreement. Therefore, the invoices received by the Authority are transmitted to the Developer for payment directly to BNSF within 60 days of the invoice date according to Section 7 of the C&M agreement. Future invoices received will be handled in a like manner.

Construction

March was still very cold with slow melting during the day and freezing conditions at night. A substantial amount of concrete work was accomplished; however, earthwork was very slow due to the muddy conditions on site by 11:00 a.m. each day.

0&M

RRVA continued general inspections throughout the ROW, Local Drainage inspections to ensure ditches and culverts are free from debris and ice jams, and Interim Completion Element inspections. Winter maintenance and Spring flooding preparation were the primary focus. Discussions were had about upcoming weed control and the Developer working towards securing weed control contracts.

SAFETY

The following safety-related matters occurred during the reporting period:

- 3/1/2025 ASN Reach 5, employee stepped off a dozer onto the ground and rolled his ankle. The employee declined medical treatment.
- 3/4/2025 ASN Drain 14B, employee was walking and felt discomfort in his right calf.
- 3/4/2025 ASN Drain 14B, employee turned toward the direction of a loud noise that sounded like glass breaking, the employee noticed the front glass of a skid steer broken, however, no one was operating or around the equipment.

- 3/5/2025 ASN Maple River Aqueduct, employee was moving forms with a skid steer when the forms slid off the forks and contacted a Meyer employee's personal vehicle causing damage to the running board. No injuries were reported.
- 3/5/2025 ASN Sheyenne River Aqueduct, an ASN's spotter was spotting a crawler crane to park when the crane struck a toolbox causing damage to the toolbox.
- 3/6/2025 ASN 32nd Ave W Crossing, employee pinched his left thumb under a bracket that was being installed causing laceration to the thumb. The employee was taken to a medical center.
- 3/7/2025 ASN Reach 12, employee was smoothing out a haul route with a box blade scraper attached to a tractor when the tractor was pulled into the deep ruts causing damage to the front end of the tractor. No injuries were reported.
- 3/8/2025 ASN Maple River Aqueduct, employee was loading forms onto flatbed truck with a
 telehandler when the load started to sway causing the corner of the forms to come in contact with the
 hydraulic line and severing the line. Between 6-8 gallons of hydraulic fluid were spilled. ASN's
 environmental team was contacted.
- 3/11/2025 ASN Reach 12, employee operating an articulated haul truck drove down a ramp when the box end of the haul truck slid off and tipped over. The cab did not tip over and no injuries were reported.
- 3/12/2025 ASN Residence, employee was backing out of his driveway while operating an ASN vehicle when he made contact with the neighbor's personal vehicle.
- 3/13/2025 ASN Rush River Inlet employee was backing a trailer with a truck when the trailer jackknifed and came in contact with the rear bumper of the truck causing damage to the bumper. No injuries were reported.
- 3/14/2025 ASN Reach 1, employee was changing a quick connect when his wrench hit his finger causing a blood blister under his fingernail. The employee denied medical treatment.
- 3/17/2025 ASN Reach 1, employee was operating a dozer when he struck a mobile light plant that was pushed into a mobile porta John. Damage to the fender on the driver side of the porta John trailer, and damage to the front jack to both stabilizer arms and damage to the frame of one of the lights.
- 3/18/2025 ASN Raymond North, employee was operating a UTV when it hit a rut causing the UTV to tip on its side. No injuries were reported, minor damage to UTV.
- 3/20/2025 ASN Reach 1, employee was opening the tractor's door he was operating when the wind caught the door, causing the door to slam against the tractor and resulting in the door's glass to shatter.
- 3/20/2025 ASN Drain 30, employee operating a tractor with a K-tec scraper made a sharp turn and contacted the upstream headwall guardrail causing damage to one of the guardrail panels.
- 3/23/2025 SRF Maple River Aqueduct, Employee was walking down an embankment to check a field work site when he slipped and fell, injuring
- his wrist when he tried to stop his fall. Employee fractured his right wrist.
- 3/24/2025 ASN Sheyenne River Aqueduct, employee was pulling a generator with a front-end loader when the hitch of the generator sheared off from the frame of the hitch. No injuries were reported.
- 3/24/2025 ASN Reach 3, employee was operating a dozer when the right-side glass broke. No injuries were reported.
- 3/24/2025 ASN HR Office, employee was in the parking lot when she slipped on an icy area, she fell and landed on her back and left hip area.
- 3/25/2025 ASN Maple River Aqueduct, damage to an ASN enclosed trailer was discovered, the cause of the damage is unknown.
- 3/26/2025 ASN Casey's Gas Station (Horace), while backing an ASN vehicle into a parking stop, the hitch made contact with the Ice Storage unit resulting in a dent in the left door of the Ice Storage.
- 3/29/2025 Public Road (38th St SE and 38th St W intersection) ASN employee driving in their personal vehicle in to start their day shift, slid into the southeast ditch of 38th St SE. No injuries were reported.

• 3/31/2025 ASN - Public Road (38th St NW, adjacent to BNSF KO) - employee was operating a grader performing road maintenance on 38th St and BNSF KO when a rock dislodged from the right-side tire and contacted the side glass causing damage. No injuries were reported.

Testing

The number of tests carried out by the PMC by type for January are as follows: Atterberg (14); concrete cylinders (333); density testing compliance checks (30); field notes (18); hydrometer (14); Proctor (20); Sieve (1)

Survey GIS

One (1) compliance check survey was conducted at 170th St Roadway and current ditching.

The quarterly GIS geodata was received, translated into Ezri and KMJ files; File was reviewed for updated data from the past 3 months.

Cass County Monitoring of County Bridges (by HMG) (11) Field Reports submitted.

HMG had presented one monitor on site during the month of March (33) Daily Observations of Bridges were provided to the Authority.

Daily Observations/Compliance Checks:

The PMC team conducted on behalf of the Authority: (1080) observations in the March 2025 reporting period; (180) compliance checks were conducted for compliance referencing the Technical Requirements and the Released for Construction (RFC) Documents. (29) related punch list items and (11) issues were noted that the Contractor was able to resolve readily.

UTILITIES:

- Utility design work is complete, and Released for Construction (RFC) documents have been issued for all the 105 Utility Buildable Units (BUs) in the Developer's scope. *Includes 3 RFCs for WAPA issued 1-Apr-25*.
- Utility Submittal Summary:
 - 61 Preliminary Design Reports.
 - 79 Final Design Reports.
 - 83 Construction Document submittals.
 - 83 sets of RFC Documents.
 - 116 Inspection and Test Plans (ITPs) have been approved for Utility activities.
 - 53 shop drawing submittals for Developer managed Utility relocations are approved.
- Overall, 37 of 108 identified utility conflicts (34%) have all work including HDD void grouting and removal of abandoned facilities completed.
- Relocations for 54 of the 61 utilities to be buried under the channel are tied-in or cut over.
- Abandoned/retired utility facilities have been removed for 39 Utility BUs. Buried segments of 50 utilities still need to be removed.
- The voids have been grouted on both the entry and exit sides at 34 HDD installations. Seven bores still require grouting on both sides and 3 require the HDD void to be grouted on one side only.
- Adjustments for only 2 of the 14 overhead electric transmission lines crossing the channel ROW are complete, the Otter Tail Power (OT1) 115 kV line to remain in place and the Xcel Energy (XE3) 230 kV line south of 32nd Ave W.

 Brink Constructors is currently working on 2 Minnkota Power Cooperative 69 kV overhead electric transmission lines in Reach 1. The work includes erecting 44 new steel structures and removing 25 existing poles.

The three ICEs relating to the BNSF Shooflies were certified in early February.

The ICE for Drain 30 was rejected by the Authority in March 2025 after its second review cycle.

The ICE for Drain 29 was delivered to the Authority in late March 10 days after its anticipated notification date, and is in review.

The ICE for Diversion Channel Reach 2 was due to be received by the Authority in December 2024 but remains undelivered by the Developer.

The ICEs for CR32 and CR4/31 Crossings were due to be received by the Authority in February but remain undelivered by the Developer.

TECHNICAL

Design Review

Progress continues to be made with submittal, review, and completion of design documents.

• The Developer target of design completion in August 2024 was not achieved. Remaining design packages are predominantly "small" project components focusing on Access and Security associated with the project site.

- Design revisions, albeit minimal, continue this reporting period. Revisions are classified as "major" or "minor" depending on the magnitude and complexity of change. The number of changes to the original Released for Construction Documents that have been made are comparable to other programs of this scope and magnitude.
- Anticipated receipt of revised Aqueduct re-designs incorporating meanders in the engineered channel have been received and are in review. Resolution to this long-debated item was achieved in November with target delivery by the Developer in December, only just received. Delay in receipt is solely the responsibility of the Developer.
- Concerns raised by the Developer to their internal delivery team (ASN) regarding ability to perform
 contractually required maintenance on both the Sheyenne and Maple Aqueducts became more focused this
 reporting period. Ongoing discussions with the Authority and Agencies took place. Options are being prepared
 by the Developer including redesign and operational protocols to allow for maintenance to be completed per
 the project agreement. This is entirely a Developer issue, which appears not to have been thoroughly vetted
 by their Operations team during the design phase.
- Positive progress continues with the Authority Administration Building. Coordination with City and County Commissions, Agencies and Departments is well underway. Anticipated design completion in spring of 2025 with construction initiation to proceed immediately following.
- FDR for re-design of the specific elements of the Diversion Outlet is awaited after IDR comments were returned to the Developer in mid-January.

Agency Coordination

Agency specific coordination including initial design review and design change review continues this reporting period. Bi-weekly and as required meetings are being held with the following agencies.

NDDOT

- No significant concerns this reporting period
- o Standing coordination meetings with NDDOT continue.
- There are no technical issues or concerns to report currently.
- Ongoing coordination underway in the event modifications need to be made to address winter conditions in work zones (inactive)

Cass County

- No significant concerns this reporting period
- Standing coordination meetings with Cass County continue.
- There are no technical issues or concerns to report currently.

BNSF

- Standing coordination meetings with BNSF continue.
- Coordination and communication with BNSF leadership and staff remains good.
- o Resolution of clarifications, questions and minor revisions has been accomplished with minimal issue.

Challenges

- Modification of Aqueducts to provide ability to comply with maintenance requirements
- Developer incorporation of comments in the H&H model
- Diversion Outlet redesign review by agencies.

Successes

Continued positive progress on development of Authority Administration Building (AAB)

Receipt of initial Interim Completion Packages seen this reporting period. Technical content appears to be well
organized and missing minimal components. This is significant as this step is the first of several which will
confirm parts of the project are "substantially complete"

ENVIRONMENTAL

Environmental Compliance

2024 Section 404 Permit Special Condition M: The Developer has concluded it will reconstruct the Rush River Inlet to the RFCs in Spring 2025. The Authority submitted the required documentation to USACE on December 11, 2024, to satisfy Special Condition M for the Rush River Inlet; comments were received from USACE on January 8, 2025, and the Authority's response was submitted back to USACE on January 30, 2025; approval was received on February 12, 2025. When appropriate, similar documentation is required for both the Sheyenne and Maple River Aqueducts.

Permanent native vegetation planting occurred during the construction season in 2024. 3,508 trees were planted, and 1,077 acres of native grasses were seeded in Reaches 1, 2 and 3 during 2024; planting/seeding work is suspended until conditions allow sometime in spring 2025 this year. USACE approved the 2025 seed mixes on March 5, 2025.

<u>2024 404 Permit</u> – USFWS issued new maps for the range of the Northern Long-Eared Bat which now exclude the Project area. USACE will issue a letter amendment to the 2024 Section 404 Permit that addresses this change and

also addresses corrections to the wetlands mitigation acreages (approximately five acres). Sheyenne River Sovereign Lands Permit - RRVA submitted their supplemental information on October 6, 2024, and we are awaiting NDDWR's issuance of the permit. RRVA informed the Authority, during the January 14, 2025, Environmental Biweekly meeting, that NDDWR is waiting for resolution of the maintenance method at the Sheyenne River Aqueduct before issuing this permit. No change.

Cultural Monitoring

No cultural monitoring occurred due to weather conditions; it is expected to resume sometime in Spring 2025 with work at Site 14/TR-9 (Sheyenne Aqueduct area (stump grinding) and at Site 2 (utility removal), provided weather conditions allow. No change.

Mussel Salvage

The Authority requested RRVA's draft RFP for mussel and fish salvage and anticipate receiving it in the next month or two. No change in March – RRVA is considering preventative nets.

Spills, Contamination and Hazardous Materials

No new spills were reported.

RRVA reported on February 26, 2025, that a preliminary lab report indicates the presence of asbestos, a CERCLA hazardous material, in structures at OIN 1199N (near the Sheyenne River) and is reaching out to NDDEQ to determine the requirements for proper management and disposal, these details will be sent to us along with final lab reports.

Environmental Nonconformances (NCRs)

No activity regarding Environmental NCRs this month.

RESILIENCE AND SUSTAINABILITY

Resilience

The Resilience 2024 Annual Report was reviewed and rejected incomplete on February 27, 2025, and is awaiting resubmittal.

The Resilience Program Plan update for February was received mid-month and is under review.

Sustainability

 RRVA's Sustainability efforts outside of the PA are: 1. Education and Skills; 2. Renewable Energy; and 3. Culture & Heritage. A Sustainability update meeting was held on February 13, 2025; RRVA is continuing to work on several fronts – details available upon request.

FEDERAL COMPLIANCE

Reporting

The 2024 FRC Annual Report, was re-submitted, following its rejection in February, on March 17, 2025 and is under review.

Davis Bacon

An informal review of updates to the certified payrolls for 2024 has been conducted with disappointing results. Discussions with the Developer are ongoing regarding the apparent lack of quality control process. The Developer has stated that they plan a complete rewrite of the Federal Requirements Compliance Plan which will address quality control processes.

EMPLOYEE APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

The 2024 EAP Annual Report was resubmitted following its rejection in February and accepted on March 20, 2025. It has also been submitted per the ongoing FOIA request. Apprenticeship goals continue to be running lower than anticipated which the Developer states is primarily due to their self-performing less work than planned at bid time, therefore less control over the apprenticeship programs, although they continue their efforts to increase apprenticeships opportunities (about 10% for the D&C Contractor, which reduces to 6% against all labor hours due to subcontractors having fewer apprentices, vs the initial target of 20%).

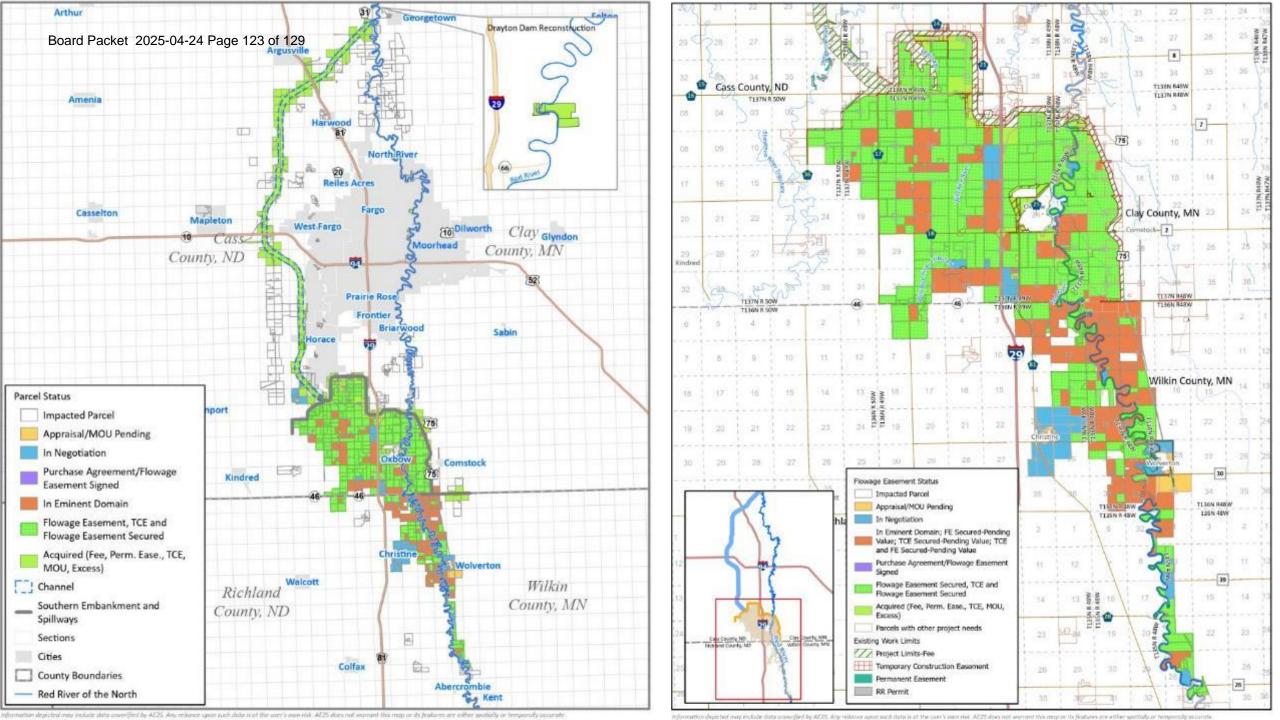

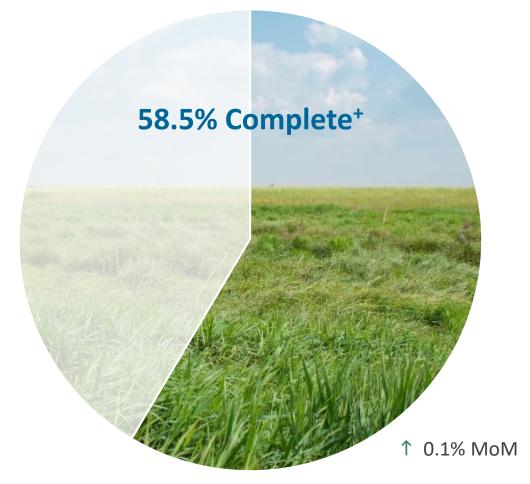
Property Acquisition Progress



Construction Footprint*



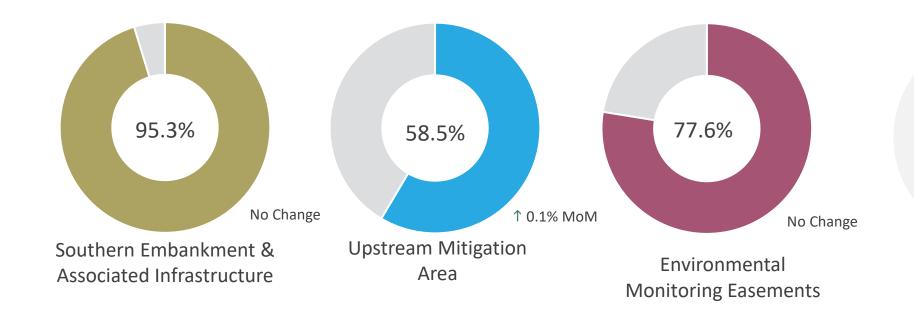

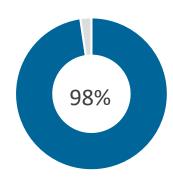

Construction Footprint*



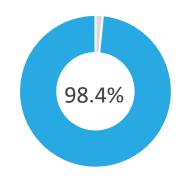

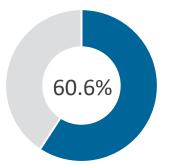

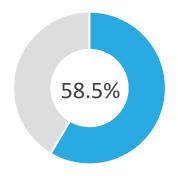
